## To support your child's learning at home this week you could...

Try to do some counting at home: How many pieces of fruit do you have? How many bananas are there? How many oranges are there? If you have a dice at home you might like to play a game using one and the children can tell you which number you have rolled on the dice.

When reading with your child, encourage them to look for words with this week's digraphs e.g. light, bright etc.

You might like to visit the library to find some superhero stories, some everyday heroes non-fiction books (firefighters, police officers, nurses, doctors etc). You may also find some books about superheroes on Bug Club. The children now have their logins in the front of their reading diaries.
