Year One – Week Commencing 8th March 2021

This week in Year One	We have had a wonderful first week back in Year One. The children have impressed us all massively with their resilience, adaptability, and confidence. It has been an absolute delight to see them all back learning with their friends.
Partnered Reading	In Partnered Reading this week the children have been looking at three different books. We have allocated each book to the children on Bug Club so that the children can show you how much they have progressed in their reading throughout the week. Ask your child which book they have read this week. The Toy Shop Boring, Boring The Queen's Plan
Reminder	Please ensure your child comes to school on Wednesday and Thursday in their PE kit as these are our PE days.
Maths	In Maths this week we have been recapping the learning from the last few weeks of lockdown. We have been working on addition and subtraction by first making 10, and how to write these number sentences in different ways. For example: 5 + 6 = 11 11 = 5 + 6 6 + 5 = 11 11 = 6 + 5 11 - 5 = 6 6 = 11 - 5 11 - 6 = 5 5 = 11 - 6
English	This week we have continued to learn the oral text of The Tunnel. The children created a tool kit for how to write an exciting setting description and put this into practice by working in groups to use similes, their senses and adjectives. The children then explored the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker and pondered what the little girl may be thinking and where she might go next!
Phonics	In Phonics this week we have explored the 'tch' sound in the words patch and catch, and the ch/c making the /sh/ sound (e.g., in the word chef). The children have also been learning to spell 'says' and 'our'.
