



# Weekly Learning Letter

Year One – Week Commencing 6<sup>th</sup> September

<p><b>This week in Year One...</b></p>	<p>To introduce our topic of 'We Are Heroes' the children received a letter from Super Semar who needed to recruit some new superheroes. The children had to find clues from around the classroom to find superhero capes. The children really enjoyed finding the capes around the classroom as well as outside.</p>
<p><b>Reminder</b></p>	<p>Remember we will have PE every Monday so you will need to come into school in your kit. Your child will have forest school three times this term. <p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>In Maths this week we have been looking at sorting and counting objects up to the value of 10. We have used many different resources to help us including counters, counting bears and images. We have also been representing given numbers using counters too.</p>
<p><b>English</b></p>	<p>In English this week we have been looking at labelling. We labelled a diagram of a superhero who was wearing boots, a belt, a mask and a cape. We practised segmenting the words by saying it aloud before orally saying each sound. We then wrote each sound we could hear in order to spell the words accurately. We have also been practising using full stops and capital letters in our writing. We have been writing sentences about what superpower we would have if we were a superhero.</p>
<p><b>Phonics</b></p>	<p>This week we have been recapping phonemes from Early Years. We looked at: 'igh' (night), 'oa' (goat), 'oo' (zoo), 'er' (summer), and 'ur' (burn). We practised applying these when both reading and writing sentences.</p>
<p><b>This week's spellings:</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>you, all, was, are, they</b></p> <p>If the children could practice reading and writing these words at home over the next week, this will help the children in their reading of books as well as their writing of sentences. You could write them using coloured pencils, pens, or even write the word and cut it up into each letter to rearrange it the right way.</p>

***To support your child's learning at home this week you could...***

*Write the numbers 1 to 10 on some cards. Ask your child to choose a card and then find that number of objects from around the house. It could be toys, socks or even sweets! What is the most creative thing you can find?*

*When reading with your child, encourage them to look for words with this week's digraphs.*

*You might like to visit the library to find some superhero stories, some everyday hero non-fiction books (firefighters, police officers, nurses, doctors etc). You may also find some books about superheroes on Bug Club. The children now have their logins in the front of their reading diaries.*
