About the Artist: Anthea Bee predominantly prints using linocuts. She explains ‘My inspiration generally comes from nature. I love the strong shapes of leaves, flowers and birds, but anything that catches my eye for a design is game. I usually start with a rough sketch, sometimes drawing freehand on the block or by tracing and transferring the design from my sketch book.’

Key Vocabulary		
print	To produce a second, or more, copy. Things such as books, pictures, patterns, wallpaper, newspaper and tiles are printed.	
pop art	A type of art inspired by things from popular culture. Popular culture is things that are popular – for example, Coco cola is a popular drink.	
repeating	When something is done more than once.	
overlapping	If two items are crossing over, and one is covering part of another, then they are overlapping.	
mimic	To imitate someone or something. For example, the work of a famous artist.	
glaze	To give a coating by the application of a substance to create a smooth, glossy surface.	
press	To apply pressure to flatten, shape or smooth something.	
roll	To turn something over and over on an axis.	
rub	To move two things to and fro against each other with a certain amount of friction.	
stamp	To impress a pattern or mark on a surface.	






Year 5 – Printing

About the Artist: Morris was an English artist, poet and politician. He was incredibly creative and produced decorative art in a range of different forms including textiles, furniture, wallpaper, stained glass windows, book design and tapestry.



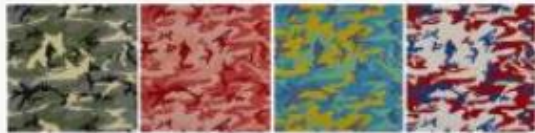

Key Vocabulary		
replicate	To make an exact copy of, or reproduce	
precise	To be accurate and/or exact	
motif	A single image, shape or symbol.	
pattern	A pattern is a repeated motif. The motif can be repeated with different organisation.	
symmetry	The quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other around an axis.	
asymmetry	A lack of equality between parts of something. A lack of symmetry.	
reflection	To create a mirror image, flipped along an axis.	
rotation	To move in a circle around an axis.	
half-drop pattern	A repeating pattern in which the motif is staggered. The motif starts half-way along the one about it.	
drop pattern	A repeating pattern in which the motifs line up beneath each other.

About the Artist: Andy Warhol was an American artist who was a leading figure in the visual art movement known as pop art. Warhol used bright colours and enjoyed screen printing to mass-produce artwork.

screen print	Screen printing is a printing technique where a mesh is used to transfer ink, except in areas made impermeable to the ink by a resist.
resist	Something applied to prevent ink transferring to the surface.
