


Weekly Learning Letter

Year One – Week Commencing 22nd November 2021

<p>This week in Year One...</p>	<p>The children have had another fantastic week! It has been filled with lots of Christmas play excitement – singing, performing and dancing! We have also enjoyed our art this week and have been focussing on printing. The children have manipulated clay to create leaf prints, and have been using polystyrene tiles to create cards in the style of Anthea Bee.</p>
<p>Partnered Reading</p>	<p>In Partnered Reading this week the children have been looking at three different books. We have allocated each book to the children on Bug Club so that the children can show you how much they have progressed in their reading throughout the week. <p>Maths</p>	<p>In Maths this week we have been beginning our learning on place value to 20. We have been exploring the teen numbers and finding out how many tens and ones are in each number. E.g. In the number 14, there is one ten and 4 ones. The children used new concrete resources (deines – pictured right) to compose these numbers</p> 

English	In English this week the children have been innovating the story of Knuffle Bunny. The children have changed their character in the story as well as the toy that they lose. The children were also able to innovate where the toy had gone missing. Next week, the children will write their new story.
Phonics	This week in Phonics the children have been learning the alternative pronunciation of 'or'. The children have learnt 'aw' in claw , 'au' in 'August' , and 'al' and 'our' in 'tall' and 'pour' .
