



Weekly Learning Letter

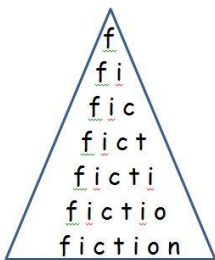
Year One – Week Commencing 10th January 2022

This week in Year One...	<p>The children have had a fantastic start to 2022. We have met Mrs Trotter and Mr Wolf, and even got the chance to visit the Theatre to see Cinderella to launch our topic of The Three Little Pigs! The children had an amazing time watching the performance. We hope the children have shared their wonderful experience at home.</p>
Partnered Reading	<p>In Partnered Reading this week the children have been looking at three different books. We have allocated each book to the children on Bug Club so that the children can show you how much they have progressed in their reading throughout the week. Ask your child which book they have read this week.</p> <p><i>Bullfrog is the Best</i> <i>Follow the Clues</i> <i>Rock-pooling</i> <i>Sid's Pet Rat</i></p>
Reminder	<p>Our PE days have changed this half term. We are now having PE with Mr Gilkes on a Tuesday and there will be PE on a Thursday with Mrs Gilkes or Mrs Mercer. Please could all children come dressed in school PE attire or a navy jumper or cardigan on PE days.</p>
Maths	<p>In Maths this week we have been looking at counting on with our numbers to 20. We have been using bead strings and number lines to show how we can do this. We have also been consolidating our knowledge of number bonds to 10, showing this both practically using double sided counters or as a number sentence. E.g. $8 + 2 = 10$.</p>
English	<p>In English this week we have been introducing the story of the Three Little Pigs. We have created our own story map and used this to retell the story using puppets, story stones, character headbands and lollystick characters. The children have really loved taking on the role of each of the characters from the story. We have also been looking at The Big Bad Wolf and how we can describe him using adjectives in order to write a WANTED poster to find him!</p>

<p>Phonics</p>	<p>This week in Phonics the children have been learning the alternative pronunciations of many sounds: The children have learnt: Eer/ere in deer and here. Are/ear in care and pear. We have also concentrated on: Words ending in 'nk' such as bank, think, honk and sunk and, Words ending in 've' such as have, live and give.</p>
<p>This week's spellings:</p>	<p>This week's spellings are: one, two, three, four, five.</p>

To support your child's learning at home this week you could...

Spelling - Have a go at your spellings using pyramid spellings



Maths – Can you use different foods to show your number bonds to 10 in two parts. E.g. 7 grapes and 3 grapes or you could use pieces of pasta or objects from around your house.

English – Can you retell the story of *The Three Little Pigs* to your toys at home. See if you can get into character and be a furious wolf or a frightened little pig. You could even create your own masks to do this.
