Year One – Week Commencing 9th May

<p>This week in Year One...</p>	<p>The children have had a great week! The children are loving their swimming lessons and have also enjoyed learning the song 'Yellow Submarine' in their music lessons this week. We have also really enjoyed watching our tadpoles finally grow their legs and start to climb up onto some rocks.</p>

<p>Maths</p>	<p>The children have really had a wonderful week in Maths this week. The children have enjoyed investigating a half and a quarter. The children even got a chance to eat some Jaffa Cakes in their lessons when cutting them into halves and quarters. The children have been investigating half of objects, shapes as well as quantities too.</p>

<p>English</p>	<p><i>This week the children have been continuing to look at Mrs Armitage on Wheels. The children have created their own story mountain and also designed Mrs Armitage a new vehicle as her bike crashed and broke. The children have come up with their own set of design criteria for their new vehicle and innovated this onto their story mountain. To finish the week the children have written their story innovation.</i></p>
