Year One – Week Commencing 6th June

<p>This week in Year One...</p>	<p>The children have had a wonderful start to the half-term. The children have started their topic of 'Treasure Seekers' with such enthusiasm. The children have started their topic by doing some Geography. The children have been looking at Mapping and how there are many different types of maps to show us different things.</p>
<p>Reminder</p>	<p>As the weather is getting warmer could we please ask that children bring in a cap/sunhat if it is sunny, and could sun cream please be put on the children before they come into school.</p> <p><u>Creative Arts Week – week commencing 27th June</u> During Creative Arts Week the children will be making their own piece of art made of recyclable materials. Please could we ask you to bring in any clean recyclable materials over the next 3 weeks. These can include cereal boxes, plastic bottle tops and other recyclable materials.</p>
<p>Partnered Reading</p>	<p>In Partnered Reading this week the children have been looking at three different books. We have allocated each book to the children on Bug Club so that the children can show you how much they have progressed in their reading throughout the week. Ask your child which book they have read this week.</p> <p>Sharon and Flash Flying High Dressed for the Job East of the Sun, West of the Moon</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>This week the children have been consolidating their knowledge of counting up to 50 forwards and backwards. The children have been working on partitioning as well as comparing numbers too.</p> <p>The children have then been introduced to numbers to 100 – looking at the 100 square for the first time. We have played many games of Splat and using our place value grids to aid us in locating different numbers.</p>

English	<p><i>This week the children have been concentrating on poetry. The children have learnt the poem 'The Owl and the Pussy Cat'. The children picked apart the poem to establish the story of them falling in love and getting married. The children really enjoyed creating their own Newspaper Headline based on the poem as well as creating a recount based on the points of view of the Owl and the Pussy Cat.</i></p>
Phonics	<p><i>The children have been working on consolidating their knowledge of Phase 5 sounds and words this week. The children have been working on the split digraphs as well as other Phase 5 sounds.</i></p> <p><i>Keep practising your spellings and phonics as much as you can using the website links below.</i></p>
This week's spellings	<p><i>This week the children's spellings are spellings from throughout the year. Please feel free to look back in your child's reading diary to practise any others that you feel your child needs to work on.</i></p> <p><i>Autumn, called, people, handlebar, could.</i></p>
