Year One – Week Commencing 20th June

<p>This week in Year One...</p>	<p>The children have had another great week this week. <p>Maths</p>	<p>This week the children have been working on their numbers to 100 and have been learning to compare these numbers using the symbols greater than, less than and equal to. The children have also been introduced to money. The children have been learning the names of all of the coins (silver and copper) and have been learning their value. The children have done the same with notes.</p>

<p>English</p>	<p>This week the children have been immersing themselves into our book 'The Pirates Next Door' by Jonny Duddle. The children have been learning their oral text this week and have been taking a look and learning their new vocabulary. The children have also written a letter to Jim Lad the pirate from Matilda.
