Year One – Week Commencing 11th September

This week in Year One...	<i>In science we have spent our week learning all about seasonal change and we have enjoyed finding seasonal treasures. We have also enjoyed computing with a focus on online safety. In addition to this our RE learning this week has been using our senses to explore religion and belief.</i>
Reminder	<i>Remember we will have PE every Monday so you will need to come into school in your kit. Your child will have forest school three times this term. Details have been sent separately. We are still looking for volunteers for Red Squirrels so please get in touch with Miss Munro if you can help out. Please can you return your child's collection form to either Miss Munro or Mrs Polmeer. We do have spares should you need another one.</i>
Maths	<i>In maths this week, we have practised our number formation. We have also been looking at sorting, counting, and representing objects up to the value of 10. We have used many different resources to help us including counters, counting bears and images.</i>
English	<i>In English this week we have been practising writing sentences, with a focus on capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. In addition to this we have introduced our new oral text 'How to be a Superhero'. The children have drawn a text map to help them to learn the instructions.</i>
Phonics	<i>This week in Phonics we have been recapping our phase 3 graphemes and starting to look at some phase 5 graphemes: wh, ph. We have been applying these graphemes in our writing as well as our reading.</i>
This week's spellings:	<i>This week's spellings have been stuck in your child's reading diary. If the children could practise reading and writing these words at home over the next week, this will help the children in their reading of books as well as their writing of sentences. You could write them using coloured pencils, pens, or even write the word and cut it up into each letter to rearrange it the right way.</i>
