This week in Early Years Reminder	This week in Early Years we have been learning about owls and we had a special visit from the
	Owl Raptor Foundation. The children enjoyed learning lots of interesting facts and witnessing
	how silently owls' fly. We then went back into the classroom and created owl collages.
	Your child has a reading diary that you can write down any comments of books that you have
	shared together. Once your child is blending, they will bring home a reading book to read to
	you each day. If your child is still learning to blend then practising blending at home will be a

	This week we have been comparing sets of objects to identify which has more/ fewer.
	For example, when Monkey had 5 pencils and Teddy had 2 pencils we said:
	Monkey has more pencils than Teddy.
English	Teddy has fewer pencils than Monkey.
	In English this week we have been focusing on a poem called, 'A Wide-Eyed Owl'. We have
	worked in small group to perform the poem, thinking about what makes a good performance.
	We have also used non-fiction books to find out lots of information about owls and then used
Phonics	this information to label an owl.
	This week in phonics we have learnt the sounds: h, b, f, ff, l, ll
	Here are a few examples of the words we have been reading and spelling: hug, hut, hop, bag,
	bin, big, fan, huff, huff, leg, lap, fill, hill
	We have learnt to read tricky words: I, into
