

Weekly Learning Letter

Year One – Week Commencing 20th November 2022

	Year 1 have enjoyed another week of swimming. The children are becoming more confident when changing and getting into the water.
This week in Year One	We have continued our art unit on printing, looking different prints and designing our own Christmas card. We are very excited to start making these in the next few weeks. Our clay tiles are ready to be fired in the kiln and will soon be ready for glazing.
Reminder	Our PE days are now on Tuesday. Can children please come to school wearing their PE kits. This half term, we will be swimming on a Wednesday. Each Wednesday, please send the children to school with their swimming kit underneath their PE kit. In a separate bag, please pack a towel and swimming hat. Goggles are optional. We ask that children wear trunks or tankinis — the children wear these all day, so one piece swimsuits make it very difficult for the children to go to the toilet!
Maths	In maths, we consolidated our learning of shape by sorting different 2D shapes by their different properties. We also made repeating patterns using 2D and 3D shapes.
English	In English, this week we have been innovating the story of Knuffle Bunny. We changed Knuffle Bunny to our own teddy and gave it a new name. We also changed the location in which Knuffle Bunny goes missing. We then wrote our new stories with a focus on capital letters, full stops, and finger spaces.
Phonics	In Phonics this week we have been revisiting all our phase 5 phonemes that we learnt last half term, as well as focusing on this week's sound: aw/au in words such as 'claw, paw, draw, launch, August, author'. We have read different words and sentences containing these sounds and then applied this knowledge to our writing.
