

## Weekly Learning Letter

Early Years - 11.03.24

This week in Early Years	This week we have enjoyed continuing our learning on castles, we looked at the features of a castle and how they helped to defend the people. We have designed and made our own castles and evaluated them against the success criteria we made as a class.  We have continued practising our handwriting weekly, focussing on letter size and orientation.
Reminder	It is so lovely to hear the children reading so confidently in school. Thank you to those parents hearing their children read daily as it really helps to develop fluency. We also love to read in the children's diaries what books you have been sharing at home.
Maths	In maths this week we have continued focussing on composition. The children enjoyed using cubes and Numicon to show different ways of making 10. We have also used songs to support our learning-Farmer Pete was a big hit!
English	This week in English we have continued to learn our new oral text, 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and the children have written the story.
Phonics	This week we have continued to consolidate our learning, with a focus on:  ow (cow) oi (coin) ear (beard) air (hair)  This week we have recapped tricky words: all was
