This week in Year Two	This week Arctic Wolf class have started their computing unit of work where they are coding. They are using Scratch to create a basic story with illustrations. They then turned this into an animated story using visual coding. They have been introduced to conditional language, repeat loops and debugging. Polar Bear class have started their science unit on 'Electricity'. They have Identified common appliances that run on electricity, constructed a simple series electrical circuit, identified and named its basic parts, including cells, wires and bulbs.

English	This week we have learnt a poem called The Sea by John Foster. We have created a piece of artwork in response to it and discussed what we like, dislike and brought up some questions that were raised in response to reading it. We then wrote our own sea poem based on John Foster's and published our own sea poem using our neatest handwriting and presentation skills.
Maths	We began the week by continuing our measurement unit on money. We solved simple problems by finding the difference between two totals, calculated change and then solved word problems that involve more than one step. We then started our multiplication unit where we identified and made equal groups and started to add equal groups.
Phonics & Spelling	This week we have revisited the spelling of some tricky words which we have learnt. We then went onto reading, spelling and applying our new spellings which are contracted words using the apostrophe (can't, didn't). We also looked at the common exception words wild and climb.
