Early Years — 15.4.24

| This week in Early<br>Years | It has been lovely to welcome the children back after the Easter break. We thoroughly enjoyed our visit to Colchester Castle, and we received lots of positive comments about the children's behaviour and enthusiasm.  This week we launched our topic; we went on a mini-beast hunt in the school grounds. The children enjoyed looking for insects and using magnifying glasses to observe them more closely. The children also have used their noticing skills to do an observational drawing of a minibeast. |

| Maths                       | In maths this week we have been focusing combining groups. We joined in with the rhyme Mary, Mary, Quite Contrary and then looked at some gardens full of flowers. We noticed how many of each colour there were and then combined to find how many altogether.  For example, 3 blue flowers and 2 red flowers equals 5 flowers altogether.  We than used counters and drawings to represent our calculations.  |
| English                     | In English the children have enjoyed the poem 'Hurt No Living Thing' by Christina Rossetti. They performed the poem using their own actions and animal poses and then contributed to the writing of a class version of the poem. The children have also written a minibeast riddle 'What am I?'   |
| Phonics                     | This week we have focussed on reading and spelling CVCC words: best, just, lamp, camp, pink, pond, hunt, felt, help.  The children have learnt to read tricky words: said, so   |
