This week in Early	We have recorded our Christmas play – we are sure you are going to love it ! The children all
Years	looked fabulous in their costumes and enjoyed performing the songs and dances. Thank you for
	all your support with providing costimes, it is really appreciated.
	Having read Peace at Last by Jill Murphy, we thought about night time sounds. In the story
	Mr Bear can't sleep because of all the noises he hears. We composed some lullabies (which we
	have been learning about with Mrs Cass in music) to help him sleep.

Maths	In Maths this week we have been focussing on the number 10 and learnt that 10 one penny
	coins are worth the same as one ten pence coin. We have also enhjoyed singing and acting out
	the song 'Ten green Bottles,' which has supported out learning in finding one less that a number.
English	Following on from last week's learning we have delved deeper into Christmas traditions. On
	Tuesday we received a special note. We discovered that Santa's elves were busy in the workshop
	and needed our help. Father Christmas asked us to write a list of items that we would like for
	Christmas. The children independently wrote their lists using their segmenting skills.

	This week in phonics we have continued with learning 4 more phase 3 sounds: ch, sh, th, ng.
	The children recognised that these are 2 letters that make 1 sound.
