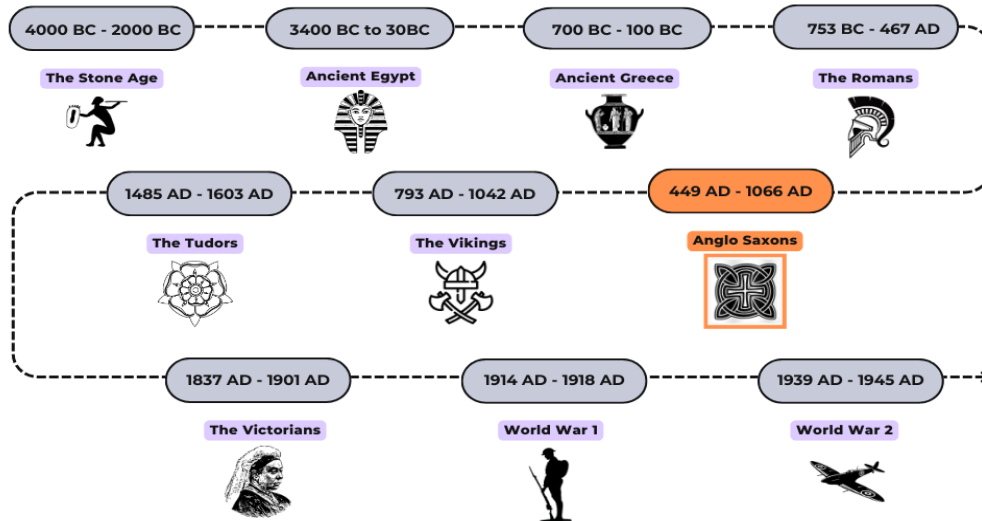

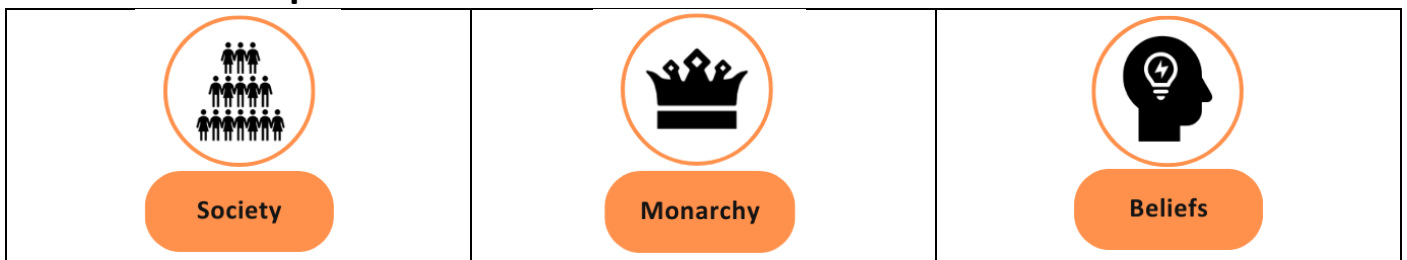

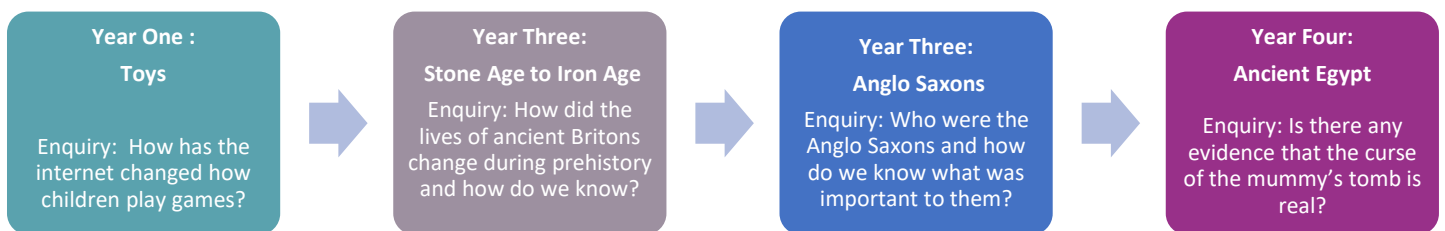

### Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>Christianity</b>	A monotheistic system of beliefs and practices as found in the Bible.
<b>Convert</b>	To change belief, especially religion, e.g. pagans to change belief to Christianity.
<b>Hierarchy</b>	A system that organises or orders things often according to power or importance.
<b>Kingdom</b>	An area or group of people ruled by the same monarch.
<b>Missionary</b>	Someone who travels, often to a foreign country, to convert people to their faith.
<b>Monarch</b>	Hereditary rulers or countries usually known as a king or queen.
<b>Monotheism</b>	The belief in a single, all-powerful god.
<b>Pagan</b>	Someone who worships more than one god.
<b>Religion / faith</b>	The belief that one or more gods are responsible for human life; an organisation where people share beliefs.
<b>Settle</b>	To make somewhere your permanent home.
<b>Settlement</b>	A small community of people, e.g. several houses grouped together.
<b>Monastery</b>	A building where a group of religious people live, in Anglo-Saxon times, these were often places for learning and helping the poor.
