




Word	Definition
Archaeologist	An archaeologist is a scientist who studies human history by digging up human remains and artefacts.
Archaeology	The study of human prehistory and history through the excavation of sites.
Artefacts	An artefact is a man-made object that has some kind of cultural significance.
Burial	A burial is the act of placing a dead person in a grave.
Grave goods	Items placed in a grave that are of significance to the dead person.
Migration	The movement of people or animals from one area or another.
Shelter	A structure or place that protects you and gives somewhere to live.
Survive	To live through hard times.
Tools	Something that helps you accomplish a task e.g. an axe to cut down a tree.
Tribes	A social group of people.
Weapon	A tool designed or used to cause bodily harm or physical damage.
