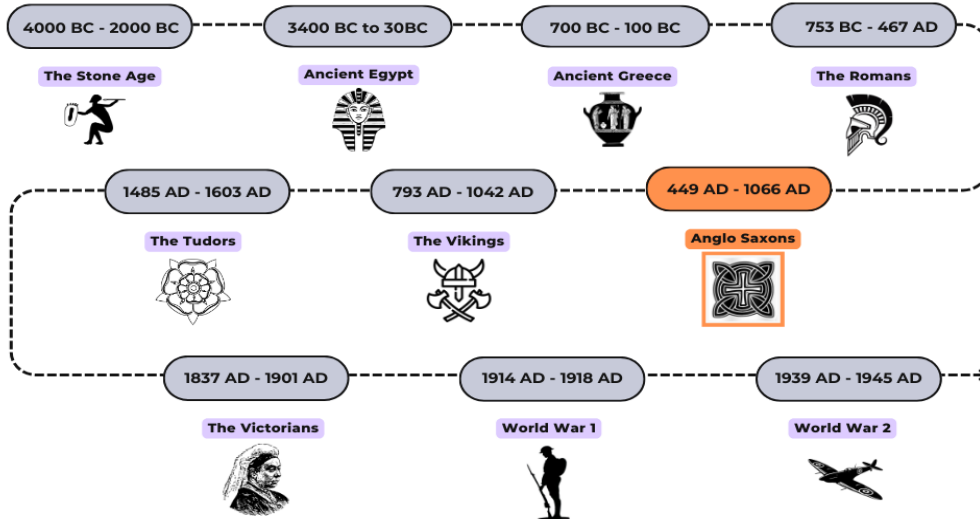

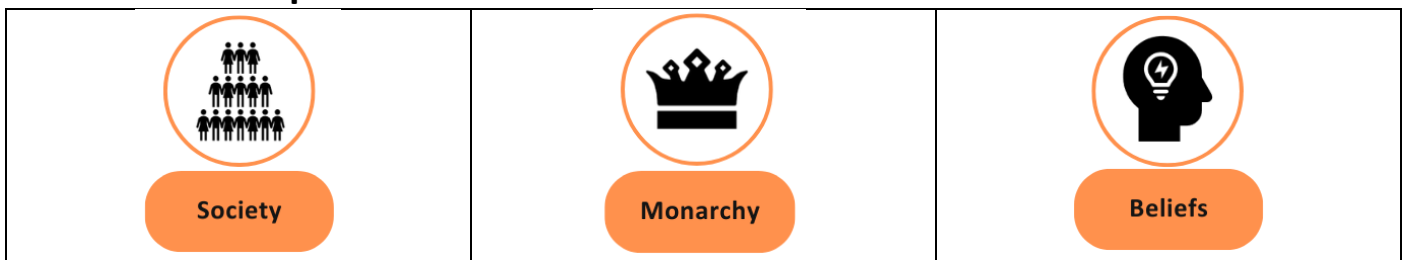

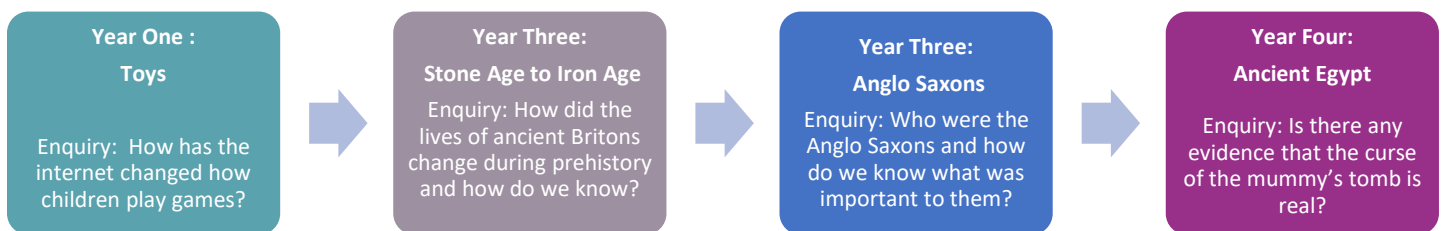

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Christianity	A monotheistic system of beliefs and practices as found in the Bible.
Convert	To change belief, especially religion, e.g. pagans to change belief to Christianity.
Hierarchy	A system that organises or orders things often according to power or importance.
Kingdom	An area or group of people ruled by the same monarch.
Missionary	Someone who travels, often to a foreign country, to convert people to their faith.
Monarch	Hereditary rulers or countries usually known as a king or queen.
Monotheism	The belief in a single, all-powerful god.
Pagan	Someone who worships more than one god.
Religion / faith	The belief that one or more gods are responsible for human life; an organisation where people share beliefs.
Settle	To make somewhere your permanent home.
Settlement	A small community of people, e.g. several houses grouped together.
Monastery	A building where a group of religious people live, in Anglo-Saxon times, these were often places for learning and helping the poor.
