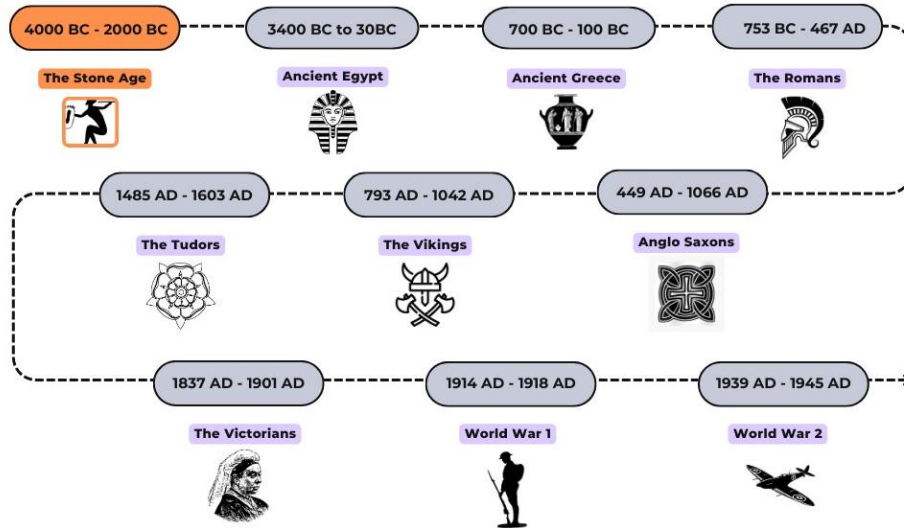

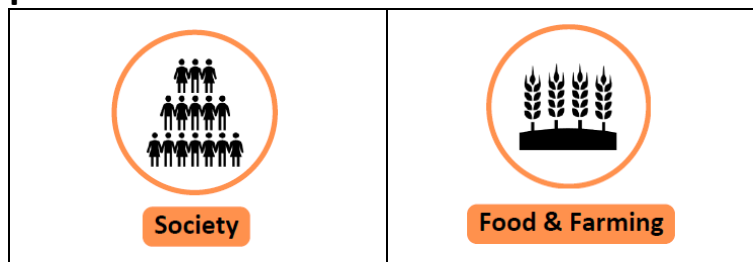

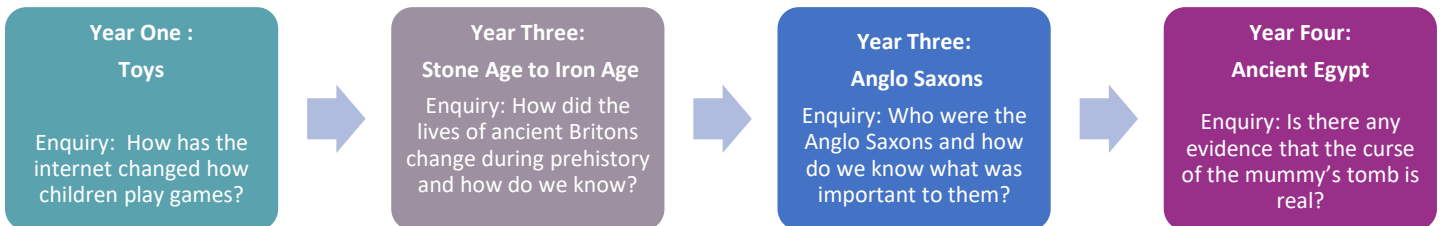

### Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>Archaeologist</b>	An archaeologist is a scientist who studies human history by digging up human remains and artefacts.
<b>Archaeology</b>	The study of human prehistory and history through the excavation of sites.
<b>Artefacts</b>	An artefact is a man-made object that has some kind of cultural significance.
<b>Burial</b>	A burial is the act of placing a dead person in a grave.
<b>Grave goods</b>	Items placed in a grave that are of significance to the dead person.
<b>Migration</b>	The movement of people or animals from one area or another.
<b>Shelter</b>	A structure or place that protects you and gives somewhere to live.
<b>Survive</b>	To live through hard times.
<b>Tools</b>	Something that helps you accomplish a task e.g. an axe to cut down a tree.
<b>Tribes</b>	A social group of people.
<b>Weapon</b>	A tool designed or used to cause bodily harm or physical damage.
