

## **Katherine Semar Infant and Junior School Forest School Toileting Procedure**

The Forest School Woodland that we will be using is offsite. Therefore, the children are toileted before leaving school building. As the Forest school is off of the school site, a suitable toilet will be set up for the children and adults to use.

The forest school toilet procedures are as follow:

- \* A site is allocated. This site will be an appropriate distance from others but will remain in the woodland area. The site will be assessed by the Forest School Leader.
- \* The allocated site will be surrounded with a wind break to mark the site and also to ensure privacy.
- \* A hole of approximately 6-8 inches is dug. Earth is replaced at the Forest School session by an adult.
- \* A plastic bag is used to collect used toilet paper. This will be taken back to the school and disposed of appropriately.
- \* Children and adults wash their hands with clean water and soap. Hands are dried using paper towels which are collected and recycled after return to school.
- \* Children will be supervised by an adult when going to and from the toilet site.
