



	<p>One parent raised a concern about whether this new approach would generate enough funds. However, school staff were optimistic that if most parents were happy to contribute to one of the proposed packages, sufficient funds could still be raised. This change is also expected to ease the load on families, as they would no longer be asked to donate multiple items or attend a crowded event.</p> <p>The school will now work on developing the details of the festive activity packages and will consult with parents on contribution options. A final decision will be made at the next meeting.</p>
4.	<p><b><u>Update to Sports Day for next year</u></b></p> <p>Following feedback from last year, the school will schedule next year’s Sports Day earlier in the summer term—ideally in late May or early June—to hopefully ensure slightly cooler temperatures. Sports Day will now be held on separate mornings for the Infant and Junior schools, starting first thing in the day so that activities can be completed before temperatures rise. This change is also designed to support parents, as we understand it’s often easier to accommodate a short visit in the morning rather than needing to take a full day off work.</p>
5	<p><b><u>Smart Phone free childhood</u></b></p> <p>We received an update from Catherine Tylke regarding the Smartphone-Free Childhood initiative. The movement is continuing to gain momentum, with all local schools now on board. It was encouraging to hear about the growing support, and we look forward to receiving more detailed information from the team during the Autumn term.</p>
