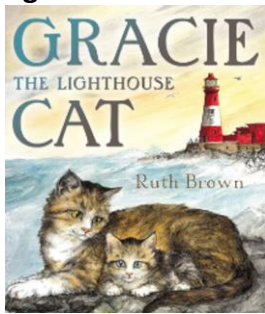

Foundation Subjects



In DT, the children have been completing a project. They were tasked to create an information book about Grace Darling which contained moving parts. The children learnt about sliders, levers and pivots. They used this knowledge to design and create their own moving picture book page. They made mock ups to test their ideas before making their final piece, and evaluated it against the success criteria they had set themselves at the start of the project which was in line with the design brief.

English



This week, the children continued their narrative unit on rescue stories. The children continued to learn their model text Gracie the Lighthouse Cat by Ruth Brown. The children gave their opinions on the book, created text maps to help them learn the structure of the story, inferred things about the two main characters in the book and wrote descriptive sentences about them both using adjectives.

Maths



This week, the children concluded their addition and subtraction unit. The children compared addition and subtraction number sentences using inequality symbols and then answered missing number problems. They then started their new unit on money. They recapped the different coins and notes we use in England, and then counted in pounds and in pence.

Phonics & Spelling



This week we have been reviewing the /i:/ sound spelt igh, i, i_e, ie and y. This weeks spellings are: **nineteen, invite, tie, high, sky, try, replying, spying**
