Foundation Subjects

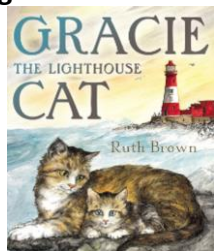


The children have continued with their Christmas play rehearsals. We can't wait to share it with you next week! Thank you for bringing in their costumes this week.

In PSHE, the children continued their unit on celebrating difference. The children learnt that it is OK to be different from other people and to be friends with them and that they shouldn't judge people if they are different from them.

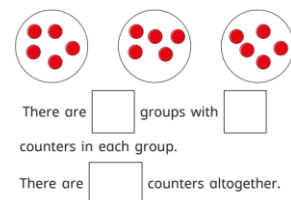
In science, the children continued their unit on living things and their habitats. The children researched animals to create their own food chains. They also learnt that the same animals/plants can be in multiple different food chains. They compared food chains and created their own where the herbivore remained the same.

English



This week, the children concluded their narrative unit on rescue stories. They innovated the story The Lighthouse Keeper's Rescue to plan and write their own rescue stories. They focused on using capital letters, full stops, adjectives and conjunctions in their writing.

Maths



This week, the children started their new unit on multiplication and division. The children learnt that objects can be grouped into equal and unequal groups. They also learnt that the number of groups and the size of groups must be defined, e.g. there are 3 equal groups with 5 in each group.

Phonics & Spelling



This week the children have reviewed the /u:/ sound spelt oo, u-e, ew and ue. They also learnt about homophones.

This week's spellings are: **smooth, tune, rescue, statue, threw, grew, write, right**
