Year One – Week Commencing 16.3.26

<p>This week in Year One...</p>	<p>Year 1 have had a fantastic week this week and thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Boydells Farm. The children got to see a cow being milked and stroked many different farm animals.</p> <p>In Science this week, we have continued to learn about the structure of different animals. This week we were looking closely at Amphibians, Reptiles and Fish. We enjoyed sorting them into groups and discussing their different features.</p>
<p>English</p>	<p>In English, we continued to look at non-fiction texts and created our very own information sheet on our chosen animal. We ended the week looking at poetry focussing on rhyme and rhythm.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>In Maths this week we have been consolidating our learning of length and height. We then began to look at mass and capacity.</p>
<p>Phonics</p>	<p>In Phonics this week we have been learning the sounds 'a' in wasp/want, 'ou' in young/couple and 'o' in son/brother.</p> <p>We have also recapped a lot of the sounds we learnt last term. We have read different words and sentences containing these new sounds and then applied this knowledge to our writing. We have also been learning a range of tricky words.</p>
<p>This week's spellings:</p>	<p>This week's spellings have been stuck into your child's reading diary. Please help your child to learn these words at home each week so they are ready for the Big Spell next week.</p>
<p>Homework</p>	<p>Read every day and record in your reading record.</p> <p>Learn your spellings.</p> <p>To continue your child's learning you could write a fact sheet about your favourite animal. What does it look like? What does it eat? Where does it live? Can you include a 'Did you know' question.</p>
