



# Weekly Learning Letter

Year One – Week Commencing 13.4.26

<p><b>This week in Year One...</b></p>	<p>Year 1 have started their new topic of 'Wheels, Wings and Wonderful Things'. In our history unit we have been exploring how vehicles have changed from past to present. The children looked at different types of vehicles and compared them based on features and how they have changed over time.</p> <p>In Science we went into the nature garden to look at the tulip bulbs that we planted in the Autumn term. We made observations of spring in our school environment and looked at our class trees and how they have changed. We also started our science topic on forces.</p>
<p><b>English</b></p>	<p>In English, we have been reading Mrs Armitage on Wheels by Quintin Blake. We looked at the character of Mrs Armitage in more detail, re-told our new model text and looked at the key vocabulary that we will be using in our writing.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>In Maths, we have started our new unit on multiplication and division. We started the week by counting efficiently in twos and tens, and how to make equal groups of 2 and 10.</p>
<p><b>Phonics</b></p>	<p>In Phonics this week we have been revisiting split digraphs and learning some rare sounds eigh, ei and ea. We have also recapped a lot of the sounds we learnt last term. We have read different words and sentences containing these new sounds and then applied this knowledge to our writing. We have also been learning a range of tricky words. Remember that on top of the spellings we send home each week you will also find lists of words for the children to read and write in their reading diaries.</p>
<p><b>This week's spellings:</b></p>	<p>This week's spellings have been stuck into your child's reading diary. Please help your child to learn these words at home each week so they are ready for the Big Spell at the end of the half term.</p>
<p><b>Homework</b></p>	<p>Read every day and record in your reading record.</p> <p>Learn your spellings.</p> <p>To continue your child's learning in English, you could Have a listen to Mrs Armitage on Wheels with your grown up.
