


# Weekly Learning Letter

<p><b>This week in Year One...</b></p>	<p>This week, Year 1 have enjoyed celebrating May Day with some wonderful singing and dancing. Thank you so much to those of you who were able to join us!</p> <p>We have also enjoyed learning about Emilia Earhart and the Wright Brothers and why they are significant people in history.</p>
<p><b>English</b></p>	<p>In English, we have continued our work inspired by Mrs Armitage on Wheels by Quintin Blake. We have designed a new vehicle for Mrs Armitage and used the conjunctions 'so' and 'because' to construct sentences to describe what Mrs Armitage could add to her vehicle and why.</p> <p>E.g. <i>She added two rainbow lights so she could see in the dark.</i></p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>In maths, we continued our learning on multiplication and division making equal groups and sharing equally between groups. We then moved on to our new topic of fractions and started exploring what a half is.</p>
<p><b>Phonics</b></p>	<p>In Phonics this week we have been revisiting split digraphs and re-capping all of our phase 5 phonemes. We have also spelt words, adding suffix er where the root word is not changed. E.g buzzer, quicker, hunter.</p>
<p><b>This week's spellings:</b></p>	<p>This week's spellings have been stuck into your child's reading diary. Please help your child to learn these words at home each week so they are ready for the Big Spell at the end of the half term.</p>
