




Weekly Learning Letter

Early Years 18.05.26

<p>This week in Early Years...</p> 	<p>This week, our classroom has been buzzing with excitement as we launched our computing learning and became brilliant little programmers! The children loved guiding Bee-Bots, pressing buttons carefully to send them zooming along tricky routes and reaching their destinations. In our Topic, LAND, things got deliciously messy! Using a selection of scrumptious ingredients, the children created their very own muddy gardens, complete with a wiggly worm hiding inside. We watched Superworm together, which sparked lots of laughter, and then the best part—everyone tasted their muddy garden creations, making learning a truly fun and memorable adventure for all the children involved.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>This week in maths has been full of fun discoveries as we explored grouping objects into pairs! The children enjoyed matching items together and spotting when one cheeky object was left all on its own. We talked about whether groups were odd or even and practised making pairs in lots of different ways. Using our pair-wise patterns, the children investigated different amounts, building confidence and excitement as they became brilliant at recognising odd and even numbers.</p>
<p>English</p> 	<p>This week we have been reading the story 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey. We discussed what we liked/disliked about the story as well as any patterns we spotted. We then created our own wanted posters about what we wanted more of in our world e.g. more flowers/trees/ plants/ animals, etc.</p>
<p>Phonics</p>	<p>This week we have been reading and spelling CCVCC/CCCVC/CCCVC words (e.g. driftwood, printer, treetop, starlight, floating, shampoo, giftbox, sandpit). .</p> <p>We have also recapped reading tricky words: there, when, what.</p>
<p>Partnered Reading</p>	<p>Books read this week: Due to Class Assemblies in Year 1 we did not have partnered reading this week. Please choose a previous book to share together.</p>
<p>Reminders</p>	<p>Please can all children bring a raincoat/jacket to school, as our English weather can be very unpredictable.</p> <p>Monday 1st June is an INSET day. We will welcome the children back on Tuesday 2nd June.</p>
