## Foundation Subjects



We loved seeing the children dress up for their Royal Ball this week – they certainly had a fun afternoon! It was a special way to end our Twisted Tales topic.

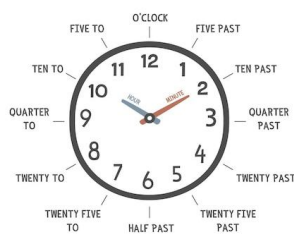
In DT, the children concluded their sewing unit. The children evaluated their finished quilt patch designs against what was asked of them in their design brief.

In PSHE, the children concluded their unit on relationships. The children learnt how to express appreciation for people in their special relationships, and how to be comfortable accepting appreciation from others.

In RE, the children explored their new enquiry question: Why do Jewish people celebrate Pesach and how do they celebrate it? They did this by exploring three mini enquiries before answering their big question: What is a celebration and why do we have them? What is Pesach? How do Jewish people celebrate Pesach? They particularly enjoyed trying some of the food eaten during the Seder meal!



## Maths



This week, the children continued their unit on time. The children learnt how to tell the time to quarter past and quarter to the hour. They then learnt about the two halves of the clock, and learnt how to tell the time in 5 minute intervals past the hour, and 5 minute intervals to the hour. *This is a skill that requires constant practice and revisiting, so it is worth practising this at home to keep the skill in their heads!*

## Phonics & Spelling



This week we have been learning the 'o' sound spelt 'a' after w and qu, the 'er' sound spelt 'or' after the letter w, and the 'or' sound spelt 'ar' after w.

This weeks spellings are: **wash, wander, squabble, squash, word, world, water, towards**  
*If your child receives alternative spellings, these have been stuck in their reading diary.*

## Homework



1. Read every day and record in your reading diary.
2. Learn this week's spellings. These have been stuck in your child's reading diary.
3. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables on Times Table Rock Stars or Hit the Button.

**Nearly all children have now earned their times table badge. They are expected to pass this before they reach to Year 3.**
